A canoe and kayak launch was installed in the Borough of Driftwood on the Sinnemahoning Creek. The project provided a launch ramp, parking area, and access road.

CHALLENGE

The Sinnemahoning valley has an avid paddling community from tourist and locals. The area was lacking access points. In addition to that, the Cameron County Conoe and Kayak

Classic held annually was in need of a permanent location that had ample parking and ease of access.

SOLUTION

A launch was created to cover both the Bennetts Branch and the Driftwood Branch as takeout points and as a starting location for the Sinnemahoning Creek. It is with hoped that this new launch will provide a much needed area for recreational and competition paddlers alike.

Purchase a new sign to replace the existing deteriorated sign that was 43 years old outdated and relocated for the traveling public's view.

Funding —

The Little Museum lies within the heart of the Lumber Heritage Region of Cameron County. It is located along the Scenic Bucktail Trail, PA Route 120, about 9 miles South of Emporium in the heart of Sterling Run, PA 15832.
